COULD HAVE BEEN AN EXECUTION!

An informed source said the shooting of Lt. Frank Looper could have been an execution by a person involved in illegal narcotics. Looper was in charge of the Greenville County Sheriff's Dept. narcotics unit.

SHOT WHILE OFF DUTY

Lt. Looper was shot while he was off duty. A person wanting to kill Looper might think his chances would be better if Looper was off duty. Maybe thinking he would be more relaxed and off guard.

JOHNSON FUNERAL HOME

EMS COMMISSION HAVE ROCKY ROAD AHEAD



Greenville County's Emergency Medical Service Commission voted to complete contracts with 6 private ambulance operators as follows: Norris Ambulance Service two, Gantt Rescue Squad 1, Atkinson Ambulance Service 1, Lowes Ambulance Service 1, and Travelers Rest Rescue Squad 1.

Joe Ledbetter spoke on behalf of Johnson Funeral Home of Travelers Rest in criticizing the commission for awarding the upper-county contract to the Travelers Rest Rescue Squad.

Ledbetter said the rescue squad is "not qualified" to operate an emergency vehicle for the county.

COMMISSION ASK TO FIRE DIRECTOR BOB PIERCE.....

Ledbetter asked the commission to fire EMS Director Bob Pierce because Pierce would not go with him to Travelers Rest to "talk to all the businessmen up there and see what the people want, because the people pay the taxes."

Ledbetter asked the commission to send two members to Travelers Rest and Slater-Marietta and talk to all the businessmen but the commission would not agree to send the two members Ledbetter requested.

JOHNSON FUNERAL HOME TO APPEAL DECISION OF COMMISSION. Mr. Joe Johnson, owner of Johnson Funeral Home serve Notice that he will continue making emergency ambulance runs and serve the public who ask for his ambulance service.

The EMS Commission said any private making emergency calls after the EMS goes into service will be fined for each call made.

Joe Johnson indicated that he would go to court to continue to provide service to those who ask.

GANTT RESCUE SQUAD SERVED NOTICE THAT THEY WILL CONTINUE TO MAKE EMERGENCY CALLS!

The Gantt Rescue Squad served notice that they will continue to make emergency calls even if it means going to court.

Luther Murrell, Assistant Chief, presented the following to the EMS Commission.

"Gentlemen: For the past 8 years, the Gantt Rescue Squad has been serving Greenville County. We have tried to give as good a service as our training and equipment have allowed. Two years ago, we set up a five year program which we felt, wupon completion would give each private individual in Greenville County free ambulance service.

In the past 5 to 10 months, the Greenville County Council and Ambulance Commission has been trying to establish a county EMS service to assist the people of Greenville County, also.

The Gantt Rescue Squad thought this was done to assist the private operators already in operation, but as the director has stated, no private ambulance service or rescue squad will be able to run an emergency after the EMS program goes into operation. This will eliminate all emergency service except that given by the county EMS at those places where county ambulances have been stationed.

The director of the EMS made a statement to me on Wednesday, February 12, 1975, that if the Gantt Rescue Squad continues to run emergencies after the program goes into operation, it will not get a county ambulance.

GANTT RESCUE SQUAD WITHDRAWS INTENT CONTRACT.....

Therefore, the Gantt Rescue Squad wishes, at this time, to withdraw our intent contract to operate one of the county ambulances. We have associated members of the Rescue Squad depending upon us for emergency and quiet calls, which have already been contracted to us. And as the director has stated, we cannot do so if we have a county ambulance.

Does One Need A Police Record To Get A Job With Sheriff Cash Williams?

That is the question being ask by persons who want to get into the field of law enforcement in Greenville County. One citizen who is in training at a local college studying law enforcement told The Mountain Monitor that he has had his application at the sheriff's office for a long time.

The citizen said in a question "Does a person have to have a Police Record before he can get a job with Sheriff Cash Williams?"

The facts are that Williams has several deputies that have criminal records. Some of the deputies have been convicted of more than one crime. One has been convicted 6 times.

BUREAUCRATIC SLIP-UP

Last week Cash Williams attributed the premature hiring of two deputies to a bureaucratic slip-up. If that is what you call the hiring of men with criminal records to wear badges and carry guns while citizen work and sleep then Mr Williams has been on banana peeling (bureaucratic that is) every since he stepped inside the Greenville County Sheriff's Office.

While our churches, businesses, homes, and citizens are robbed daily Sheriff Cash Williams continues to hire men with criminal records to patrol our street and highways.

What is that old saying "Birds of a feather flock together"

MEN NOT RECOMMENDED BY COUNTY COUNCIL!

We d. February 12, 1975 on the WFBC TV News (6:00 P.M.) Sheriff Williams tried to blame the hiring of two deputies on County Council.

In a memorandum to Cash Williams, Sheriff from J. Kenneth Luke, Acting Personnel Director Luke said Neither man could be recommended on the basis of information received when the applications were screened.


One deputy Chevis Earl Franklin was convicted of petty larceny Feb. 18, 1970 in a Newberry City recorder's Court.

According to records at the Newberry Police Department was arrested by Capt. Andrew Shealey (then Capt. -now Chief) of the Newberry S.C. Police Department.

Records show that Franklin was tried (in his absents) before Judge J.E. Wiseman February 19, 1970 found guilty and sentenced to 30 days or \$75 .

Gov. Edward Meets with Area Citizens

COVER PICTURE- Pictured on the front page is a group of area citizens from the Bethanny Baptist Church near Slater-Marietta in their meeting with Gov. Edwards in Columbia, S.C..

The group traveled to Columbia as a part of an orgination called STOP ERA to voice their opposition to the Equal Rights Amendment for women.

They requested and got a meeting with Gov. Edwards. Also requested and got a public hearing set for February 25th, 2:00 p.m. in the Judiciary Committee Room, in Columbia, S.C..

Rev. O.S. Edmonds said if the bill is passed it would mean there would be no more "statutory rape laws, prostitution laws, achild could choose either it's father or mother's name, police search without regard to sex, sgregation by sex in sleeping quarters outlawed, men and women using the same bath room in public buildings, removal of legal responsibility for a man to support his family, mother and father equally liable for child support and alimony, etc..

Rev. Edmonds encouraged citizens to make plans to be in Columbia, S.C. Feb. 25th, 2:00 P.M. for the public hearing on the Equal Rights Amendment.

Also citizens were encouraged to write or visit their Representatives letting them know how you feel about the Equal Rights Amendment.

Ways To Reimburse Crime Victims To Be Studied

WHO HAD MOTIVES TO KILL
LT. FRANK LOOPER?

SHOOTING TOOK PLACE IN- SIDE FATHER'S GARAGE.

The shooting took place inside Rufus Looper's garage, father of Lt. Frank Looper. The garage is located on Pendleton St., Greenville, S.C..

Date of the killings was Friday Jan. 31, 1975 about 2 P.M..

According to Police Reports Lt. Looper was in the house with his mother when a man who was seen walking into the garage where his father was working.

The Lt. went out to the garage to investigate and two shots reportedly were fired when he stepped inside the garage, according to the police.

Police said Looper had drawn his service revolver but the gun had not been fired. It was found next to Looper on the floor.

Lt. J. Q. Christopher of the Greenville City Police Department's Vice Squad directed the investigation.

WITNESS SAID BLACK MAN RUN FROM THE GARAGE.

A witness told police they saw a black man running on Pendleton St. just after the shots were heard

The South Carolina Department of Corrections has received a \$181,829 grant from the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration (LEAA) to study ways that victims of crimes may be reimbursed in hard cash for their losses.

Such a program could change the entire picture of corrections in South Carolina.

The grant funds will allow the Department of Corrections to conduct a study to produce workable step-by-step procedures for updating the Department's correctional industries program.

"This may well be the most important grant we have ever received," commented William D. Leeke, Director of the South Carolina Department of Corrections. "Victims of crimes involving property losses suffer, but seldom receive just compensation in dollars and cents. Such a plan could change the entire picture of corrections in this state. I have already met with two large national companies, and they have given commitments to provide technical assistance in determining the feasibility of such a program."

Leeke explained that the LEAA funds will be used to determine what industries or services might be possible in correctional institutions that could provide inmates with a higher source of income. This income would enable inmates to pay for the increasing expenses now involved in keeping an inmate in a state institution (approximately \$3,000 a year in South Carolina and about \$4,500 nationally). The earnings would also be used to repay in cash the victims of violent crimes who suffer injuries.

Leeke said an example might be auto theft. The offender would work in a correctional industry and through his earnings pay back the price of the car to the victim or to the insurance company.

"Such a program might eventually decrease insurance costs, especially for auto theft," Leeke noted.

Leeke said an additional plus for the program is that inmates would be able to send money home to support their families and thereby help relieve welfare rolls. Inmates could also pay for all or a portion of their room and board in prison through their earnings and could put aside a certain amount to help them in their adjustment to society when they are released.

The Director said such a modern industrial plan would greatly facilitate the hoped-for phasing out of the ancient and crowded Central Correctional Institution in downtown Columbia in favor of smaller, regional institutions.

Leeke said the study will attempt to identify methods of expanding the present market for products manufactured in correctional industries and will determine what new industries are needed. He said the study will also determine whether it would be feasible for the Department of Corrections to work out cooperative arrangements with private industry involving sub-contractual agreements or supplying a labor force for industry.

Leeke said recent court decisions have said that public offenders are entitled to better institutional conditions and programs of increased education and training.

"While we can see the reasoning behind these decisions, I believe that some way should be discovered so that the burden for financing such improvements in corrections should at least partially shift from the taxpayer to the offender himself. If such a program ever becomes operational it will be the first time in the history of corrections that public offenders literally pay their debts to society while maintaining some degree of self dignity," Director Leeke said.



NO MONEY TAKEN!

Lt. Christopher said apparently no money was taken from the garage.

That report led to speculation that revenge may have been the motive for the shootings.

HUNDREDS OF ARRESTS

Lt. Frank Looper was responsible for hundreds of drug law cases made against many persons since he joined the sheriff's Department.

SLUG FOUND OUTSIDE

Police found a bullet hole in the garage wall behind the spot where Lt. Looper was shot. A slug was found on the ground outside the garage where it had penetrated the wall. The slug that was found outside the garage had penetrated through Lt. Looper's head, through

the garage wall and then fell to the ground.

Lt. Looper was found next to a stationwagon parked inside the garage. His father Rufus Looper, 57 was fatally wounded near the front of the car.

LOOPER ENTERED LAW ENFORCEMENT IN OCT. 1971


In October of 1971, Sheriff J.R. Martin hired Looper and three other deputies to specialize in narcotic enforcement.

Looper grew a beard and long hair. Officers working with Looper referred to him as the "Fuzzy Beast" a nickname that stuck until Looper finished his undercover assignments and got rid of the long hair and beard.

RESIGNED FROM
SHERIFF'S DEPT.

Looper resigned from the sheriff's dept. in June 1972 to become Criminal Investigator for the 13th Judicial Circuit

Solicitor.

Looper's primary interest remained in narcotic enforcement and in October 1973 he left the Solicitor's Officer to become Lieutenant in charge of Narcotic Investigation for Sheriff Cash Williams.

WHO HAD MOTIVES TO KILL LT. FRANK LOOPER?

Any number of those who he had charged in illegal narcotic trade. Looper could have been getting to close to the "King Ping" of narcotics in the Greenville area.

Rufus Looper (Lt. Frank Looper's father) who operated a garage for many years could have had a customer that was unhappy with service etc.

STILL THE BIG QUESTION!

Could an ordinary person fire two shots and kill two men both shot in the head? Many citizens believe that the gunman had to be a HIRED GUN!

CASH WILLIAMS HAD ASKED LOOPER TO RESIGN

According to informed sources Sheriff Cash Williams had ask Lt. Looper to resign after Looper's front door of his home was shot into saying they are going to kill you.

iff's Department.


WHAT DOES THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT HAVE TO HIDE?

Sgt. Ivan Nachman, internal affairs investigator
at the Greenville County Sheriff's Department said
"I have received reliable information that an at-
tempt is being planned to frame me with a ficiti-
ous possession of narcotics or related charge or
some other type of major felony."

Nachman said "This attempt by persons unidenti-
fied at this time relates directly to my investi-
gations of corruption in the department and organ-
ized crime activity in Greenville County and its
relation to a small number of persons involved in
law enforcement."

THERE WAS A TIME WHEN ALL CHURCH DOORS WERE OPEN

There was a time when all church doors were always left unlocked. Persons could always go to the church any hour of the day or night to pray and find the doors opened.

One businessman told The Mountain Monitor that he used to go to his church and pray before making major business deals. Now he says he must go by the pastor's home or Chairman of the Board to get a key.

One church was broken into five times in 1974 and once in 1975. Several congregations place two male members outside their church to patrol the grounds while the others member worship inside. This is a shame!

This is what a group of taxpayers from upper Greenville County were told by a County Councilman at a meeting where they were making a formal request that the EMS ambulance be given to Joe Johnson, who has been serving us for some eleven years, rendering ambulance service to all who were in need.

"If you don't like our decision, you can appeal to the County Council", these same people were told at the meeting of the EMS Commission where the contract for the ambulance was approved for the Travelers Rest Rescue Squad.

Does this sound like a run-around? You bet it is! For many years, we who have chosen to live in the upper part of Greenville County have either been ignored or made to feel that we are of inferior intelligence any time that we attempt to make our wishes known to






Sheriff Cash Williams is the man who hired the above deputies NOT Co. Council!






