During the "Campaign" Cash Williams said "I don't know anything about law enforcement" . Some believe that this is the only "Campaign Promise" he has fulfilled.

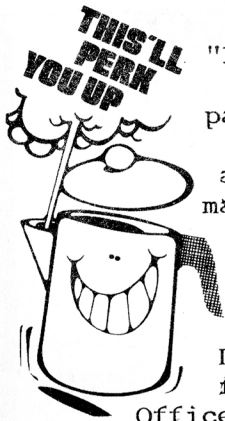

Home Purchasers Protection

In the past home buyers were at the mercy of the builder if a structural defect showed up in the home after the sale. The tragic plight of homeowners unable to get satisfaction when a defect appeared resulted in numerous lawsuits. The problem became high on the agenda of various Federal agencies.

On a voluntary basis the National Association of home builders is readying a plan that would protect the buyer from this predicament.

The plan modeled after one in effect in Britain would take the form of an insurance policy. For a small premium the home buyer would be protected for a specified length of time against the bills brought on by a structural defect.

The British plan calls for a maximum fee of approximately \$25 which protects the buyer for 10 years against building defects. The builder must be registered with the National House Builders Registration Council. Insurance will not be granted unless the house is inspected by the Council and the builder also registered with it.

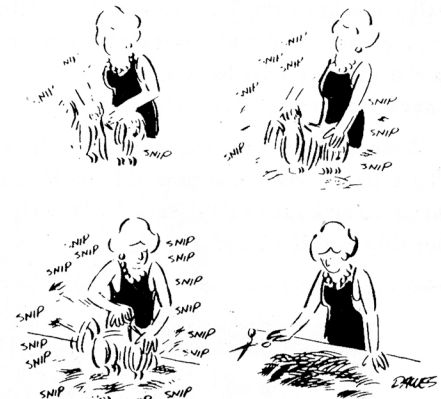
The strength of the program lies with the cooperation of Brit-

ish lending institutions. A mortgage isn't issued unless the builder is registered.

A tentative plan designed for U.S. homebuyers calls for a premium, possibly added to the cost of the house, which would provide the buyer with a warranty against structural defect.

The builder would correct any defect that appears in the first two years. The buyer would also be protected for an additional eight years for repairs of defects.

Such a plan would not only eliminate financial disaster for the buyer, but would also do a great deal of good for the building industry which suffers in reputation for the manner in which a problem of this sort is handled.



New Whirlybird

In less than a decade, the light helicopter has taken its place in public and corporate transportation, according to the Bell Helicopter Co.

The first four-place Bell model was delivered in 1956. It replaced a three-place machine. It separated the pilot from passengers and made an appreciable dent in the corporate market.

A five-place turbine powered helicopter was unveiled in January 1967 and, by 1971, resulted in 1,100 sales. Now a new seven-place helicopter is expected to hit a new high in whirlybird use.

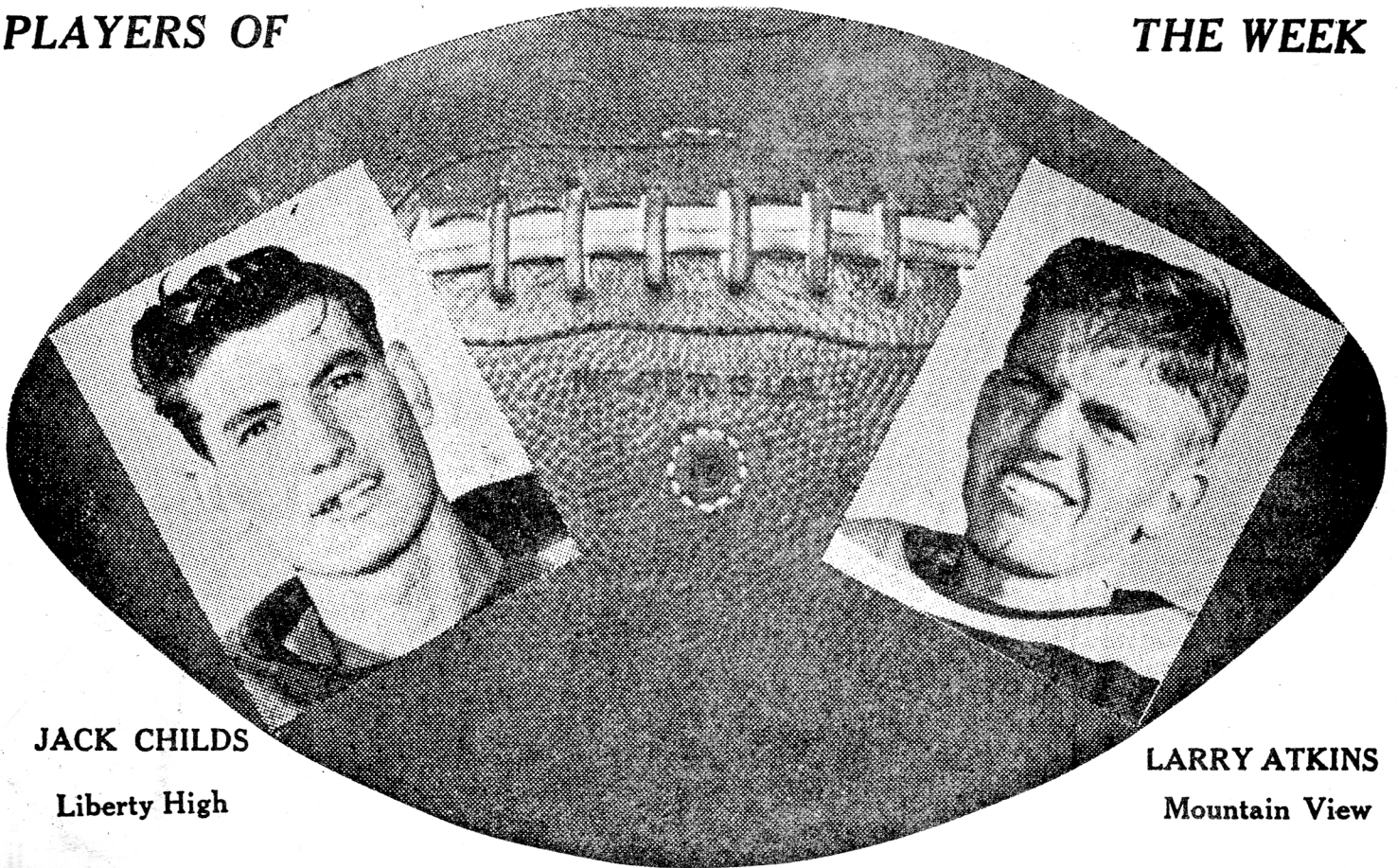

THE PIEDMONT'S PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Childs, Atkins Get Honors For Week

A lineman who spent most of the game in the opposition's backfield and a back on whose arm his team rode to its first victory of the year get this week's plaudits in The Piedmont's Player of the Week selection.

Jack Childs, Liberty High tackle, and Larry Atkins, pass-slinging quarterback from Mountain View, have been named Players of the Week for their outstanding performances in area high school games last week. It is the initial dual selection made by The Piedmont sports department this season.

The selection of Childs was a result of his sterling defensive play against Seneca last week. Time and again he broke through to smear Seneca runners for losses, and seldom did they come over his side of the line for any appreciable gains.

On one occasion Childs charged so quickly that he knocked the ball from the Seneca quarterback's hands, and Coach Bill Carr credited Childs with being in on at least half of the tackles made all night by Liberty as the Red Devils won 39-12.

This is Childs' third year in football. He has earned two football block letters and will be graduated at the end of the current school year. A 180-pounder, he stands six feet one inch in his stocking feet and is the son of Thomas W. Childs.

Mountain View's grid fortunes have been at low tide this season, but the bright spot in the picture has been the playing of Larry Atkins, the throwing end of a passing combination.

Last Friday night Mountain View copped its initial win of the season, a 20-13 victory over Simpsonville, and Larry was involved in each of the three Mountain View TD's.

He tossed a pass to his brother, Morris Atkins, for the first six points, went over from the Whirlwind four for the second tally and then threw a 15-yard pass to Hugh Crain for the game-winning score. Larry passed to his brother for one extra point and scored the other on a run.

When the game was over, Coach Lewis Lockaby found that his star quarterback had completed 15 out of 26 passes for the spectacular total of 300 yards. He likewise contributed heavily to the ground attack and was called by Coach Lockaby "one of the fastest men I've seen on a high school field."

Atkins is one of those triple-threat rarities. He operates from the quarterback slot when Mountain View uses the split-T formation and moves into the tailback slot when they're running from the single wing formation.

Other winners of the Player of the Week award in past weeks have been Billy Nelson of Fountain Inn, Wayne Templeton of Laurens, Jim Coleman of Honea Path, Eldred Toole of Greer, Bill Harbin of Travelers Rest, Billy Nally of Central and Buddy Stephenson of Slater-Marietta.

We, The under signed residents and property owners in the Travelers Rest - Slater - Marietta Communities, and parents of students attending Northwest Middle School hereby Petition The S.C.
